COPPERFIELD

We have great pleasure in presenting this rehearsed reading of the new adaptation of David Copperfield. We hope that it will give our audience a flavour of the musical, with score by Tobias Kunzell, which we will be presenting as soon as current restrictions on live theatre are eased.

David Copperfield was Charles Dickens's favourite (fictional) child and the closest he came to writing an autobiography. It is no coincidence that David Copperfield's initials are Charles Dickens in reverse. Our adaptation is taken from the new musical "Copperfield!" which we hope will have its world premiere next year at Upstairs at the Gatehouse. My biggest regret in adapting Dickens's great novel is the necessity of cutting some of the wonderful characters and their scenes.

CHARLES DICKENS

Born in Portsmouth, Dickens left school to work in a 'blacking' factory when his father was incarcerated in a debtors' prison. Despite his lack of formal education, he edited a weekly journal for 20 years, wrote 15 novels, five novellas, hundreds of short stories and non-fiction articles, lectured and performed readings extensively, was an indefatigable letter writer, and campaigned vigorously for children's rights, education, and other social reforms. When he died in 1870 he was probably one of the most well-known and influential writers in the world, a position he retains to this

HARRY MEACHER Won a major award to R.A.D.A. and has worked as an actor, director, and writer. He has travelled extensively, and directed Shakespeare, Ibsen, Chekhov, Strindberg, Shaw, Wilde, and many new pieces of writing. Since 2006 Harry has directed his own play *Through Casa Guidi Windows*, an intimate portrait of the Brownings, playing opposite his wife Judi Bowker and touring

South America. He directed and adapted Ibsen's *Ghosts, Hedda Gabler, The Master Builder* and Strindberg's *The Dance of Death*. For Traffic of the Stage he directed John Cooper's *Education of a Lap Dancer, 21st Century Faust* and many of his classical adaptations including Jane Austen's *Emma*. In 2009 he directed and played in *The Tempest, Twelfth Night*, Chekhov's *Ivanov*, with Judi Bowker as Anna, *A Midsummers Night Dream* and his own adaptation of *Wind In The Willows*. In 2010 he wrote, directed and acted in his new play *Mist After Dracula*, for Handplay Productions, in Kessel Castle in Holland. In the last two years he has played Macbeth and Benedict in *Much Ado About Nothing on* a UK tour. He has recently been seen at Upstairs at the Gatehouse in *Hay Fever*, directed by Bryan Hands, Chekhov's *The Bear* and his own play *The Ghosts*. In Germany where he directed a musical, *Comeback Karl Marx*!! Last year he played the title role in *John Gabriel Borkman* at Upstairs at the Gatehouse.



ANDREW McROBB For 15 years, Andrew was resident costume designer for Playfare Productions He has designed costumes for Traffic of the Stage, – 'Much Ado About Nothing' – 'Macbeth' – 'Romeo and Juliet' and 'Hay Fever', he has also designed – 'Candida' – 'Nude with Violin' amongst others. In 2018, he designed the costumes for the successful 'John Gabriel Borkman' at Upstairs at the Gatehouse

for Handplay Productions. When his design work permits, Andrew returns to his first love, acting, most recently playing Cornelius Gurlitt, the lead, in American playwright F. Lynne Bachleva's 'Stolen' for PMJ Productions





Roles include Hedda Gabler, Titania in A Midsummers Night Dream, Anna in Chekhov's Ivanov, Nina, in The Seagull, Masha in Three Sisters and Mrs Lyons in Harry Meacher's adaption of Sherlock Holmes. In 2013/14 Judi played Lady Macbeth and Beatrice in Much Ado About Nothing for Traffic of the Stage Touring. She was recently seen at Upstairs at the Gatehouse in Hay Fever, directed by Bryan Hands and Traffic of the Stage's production of Chekhov's The Bear and a new play Ghosts. Last year she played Ella Rentheim in Ibsen's John Gabriel Borkman also at The Gatehouse.



BRYAN HANDS Made an early start in the business on radio for BBC 'Children's Hour'. He trained at RADA and has worked as an actor, producer, director and writer ever since. He has worked in rep, in the West End and toured in this country and abroad. Favourite roles include Doc in *Small Craft Warnings* by Tennessee Williams, Frank in *Educating Rita*, Dad

in *Greek* by Steven Berkoff, and Doctor Rance in *What the Butler Saw* by Joe Orton. JOHN HASLER is an actor and voice-over artist, who is best known as T-shirt in the children's television series T-Bag from 1985–92. He was the only character to remain with the show for its entire television run, starting as a young boy and leaving as a teenager, he's also known for voicing Thomas the Tank Engine in the UK dub of the children's television. John has been a member of the cast of both the touring and the west end productions of Disney's The Lion King in the role of Timon! He

spent two years with the tour from the original cast and then was in the role at the Lyceum Theatre in London where he got to perform at the 15th anniversary gala performance
